

Announcement of College of Population Studies
Chulalongkorn University
Regarding job opening for academic staff
Position: Lecturer level A-5

The College of Population Studies, Chulalongkorn University, would like to announce four job opening for the position of Lecturer level A5 (university academic staff), with the starting salary of 41,000 baht. The details are as follows:

1. General qualifications

The applicant must have the general qualifications according to Chulalongkorn University's Regulations regarding Personnel Management 2557 B.E. as follows.

- (1.1) The applicant must be 18 years or older.
- (1.2) The applicant is not an insane person, nor an incompetent person. The applicant does not have diseases specified in the University Announcement.
- (1.3) The applicant is not during the suspension period nor has been dismissed from a civil servant job.
- (1.4) The applicant does not hold a political position, is not an executive committee member of a political party, nor is a staff in a political party.
- (1.5) The applicant has never been jailed, except in the case where the offense was committed by negligence or in the case of misdemeanor.
- (1.6) The applicant was never punished by being asked to leave the job, or fired, according to this regulation. The applicant was never punished by being asked to leave the job, fired, or having the contract terminated due to serious breach of discipline according to rules, regulations, or other announcement that was in place before this regulation was in place.
- (1.7) The applicant was never asked to leave, dismissed, nor fired from the government, state enterprise, other government agencies, private companies, or international organizations.
- (1.8) The applicant never committed malpractice in examination or any process of selection to become a civil servant, or to work in a university or government sector.
- (1.9) The applicant does not lack good morals.
- (1.10) The applicant is not currently in the state of bankruptcy as imposed by a court order.
- (1.11) The applicant's work contract has never been terminated because the applicant did not progress to higher academic position within the time frame set by Chulalongkorn University's Regulations regarding Personnel Management 2557 B.E., or the University Council did not approve of the higher academic position.

2. Position-specific qualifications

- 2.1 The applicant has a PhD in demography, social science, science, or public policy which is related to demography (for example, sociology, environment, public health science, economics, statistics, actuarial science, gerontology, geriatrics).
- 2.2 The applicant has academic work which has been peer reviewed (books, chapters in books, journal articles, conference proceedings) which are in international database, or has experience of full time teaching at the Master or PhD level.
- 2.3 Applicants with experience in the formulation of population-related public policy will receive special consideration.
- 2.4 The applicant must have one of the following qualifications:
 - 2.4.1 The applicant must have one of the following English test scores (the test must have been taken within the past 2 years):
 - TOEFL (Paper-based Test: PBT) score At least 550, or
 - TOEFL (Institutional Test Program: ITP) score At least 550, or
 - TOEFL (Internet-based Test: IBT) score At least 79, or
 - CU-TEP score At least 75, or
 - IELTS score At least 6.5
 - 2.4.2 The applicant graduated from a program in a university which uses English as a medium of instruction, or a country which uses English as an official language as specified by the personnel management committee, which are: the United Kingdom, the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, Singapore, the Philippines, India, South Africa, and Hong Kong.

3. Selection criteria:

- 3.1 Evaluation of educational background, work experience, and academic output
- 3.2 Written exam, which is conducted in English, to evaluate field-specific knowledge and competency in relation with the field of demography (approximately 2 hours) (only those who passed the evaluation in 3.1)
- 3.3 Teaching examination (conducted in English), which is divided into presentation of academic work and answering questions (approximately 1 hour) (only those who passed the evaluation in 3.2)
- 3.4 Interview to evaluate communication skills, Thai language skills, as well as characteristics and suitability as a lecturer at the College of Population Studies (only those who passed the evaluation in 3.2)

4. Decision rule

The applicant must have at least 70 marks for each section. The applicants are ranked from highest to lower scores.

5. Required evidence

- 5.1 One photograph (3×4 cm) taken within the past 6 months
- 5.2 Household registration and identity card (or passport in the case of non-Thais)
- 5.3 Evidence of educational qualifications and evidence of work experience (if applicable)
- 5.4 Evidence of English test scores (TOEFL or CU-TEP or IELTS). The test must have been taken within the past 2 years (from the last day of the application period).
- 5.5 Evidence of change of first name or last name (if applicable)
- 5.6 A copy of the military reserve letter (SorDor 9) (in the case that the applicant is a Thai male)
- 5.7 Evidence that the applicant has passed English tests (if applicable)
- 5.8 Curriculum Vitae and copies of publications (if applicable)

For documents 5.2-5.8, please attach copies which are signed and stated “This is a true copy of the original.” through the website together with the application form.

6. Date, time, and place of application
